Necrotizing enterocolitis in infants

Currently, there is an outbreak of necrotizing enterocolitis (NEC) in premature infants in the United States, associated with the consumption of SimplyThick[®], a thickening product that can be added to liquids, such as breast milk and infant formula to make them easier to swallow.

Health Canada has confirmed that thickening products are sold in Canada (www.hc-sc.gc.ca/a-hc-asc/media/advisories-avis/_2011/2011_72-eng.php). The Public Health Agency of Canada has commissioned this survey to assess if any presentations of NEC in Canadian infants may have been associated with a thickening product.
